Background information about housing insecurity:

Families and individuals are at risk of losing housing or unhoused and unable to access housing when housing prices are above their incomes. They are also displaced when the condition of their housing deteriorates to the point it is unsafe to remain and when relationships are broken. The housing market—and therefore the income needed for stable housing—varies widely but throughout our state and country, everywhere there is a deepening shortage of housing units affordable to those with extremely low incomes, especially families with children, seniors, people with disabilities, and low-wage workers. Short supply and high demand for housing pushes costs higher, displacing more people, especially in regions of prosperity.
